School in a Box



In a village where there are more than 30 out of school girls in the age group of 6yrs to 14 yrs., SKB School in a box is sent – teacher appointed & trained, community is engaged – place finalised, time decided, level testing done and the program begins. The box contains daree, board, stools, stationery, SKB curriculum book, charts, files, competency test papers, teaching manual, bell, first aid box, charts, maps etc.

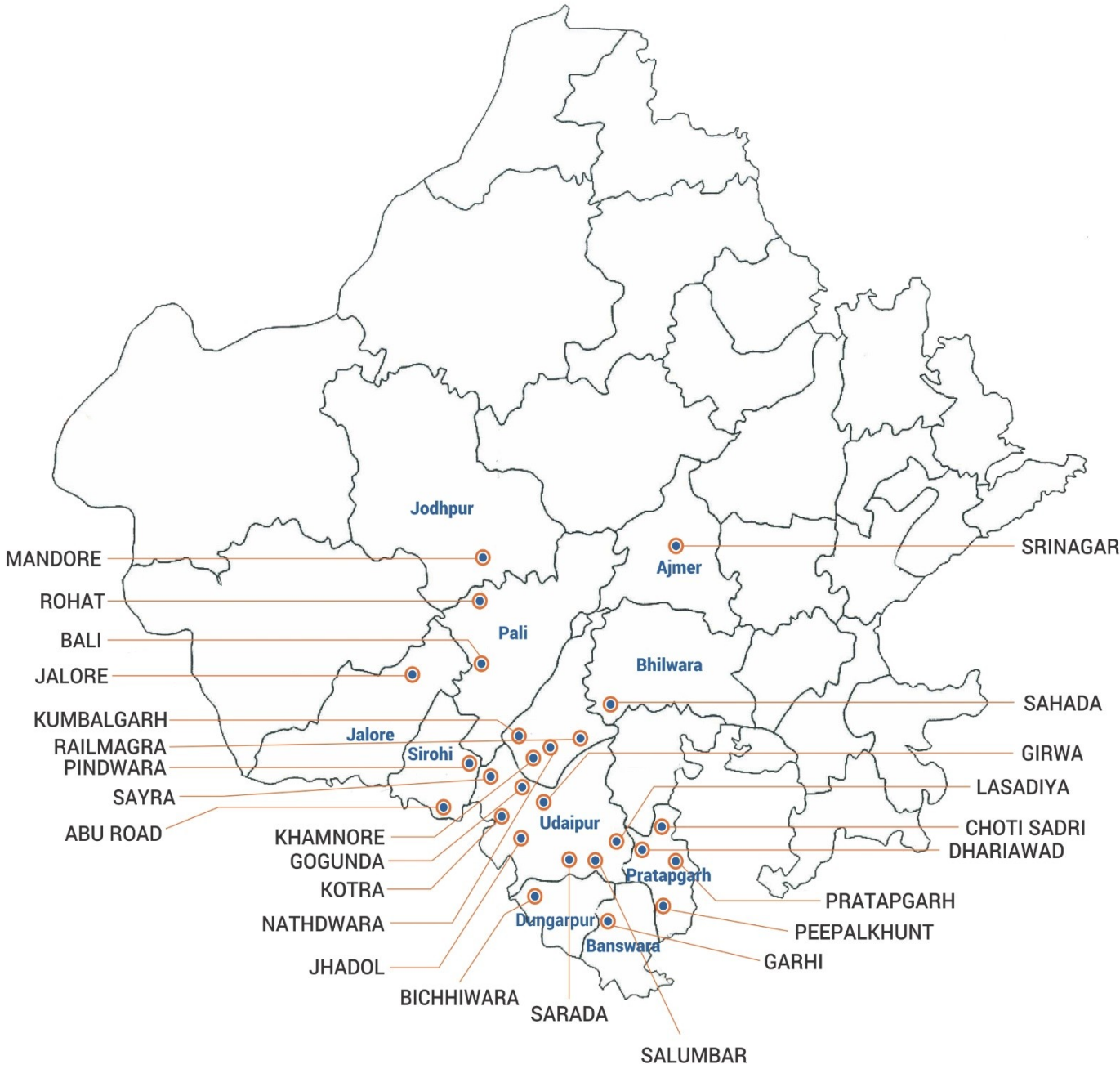

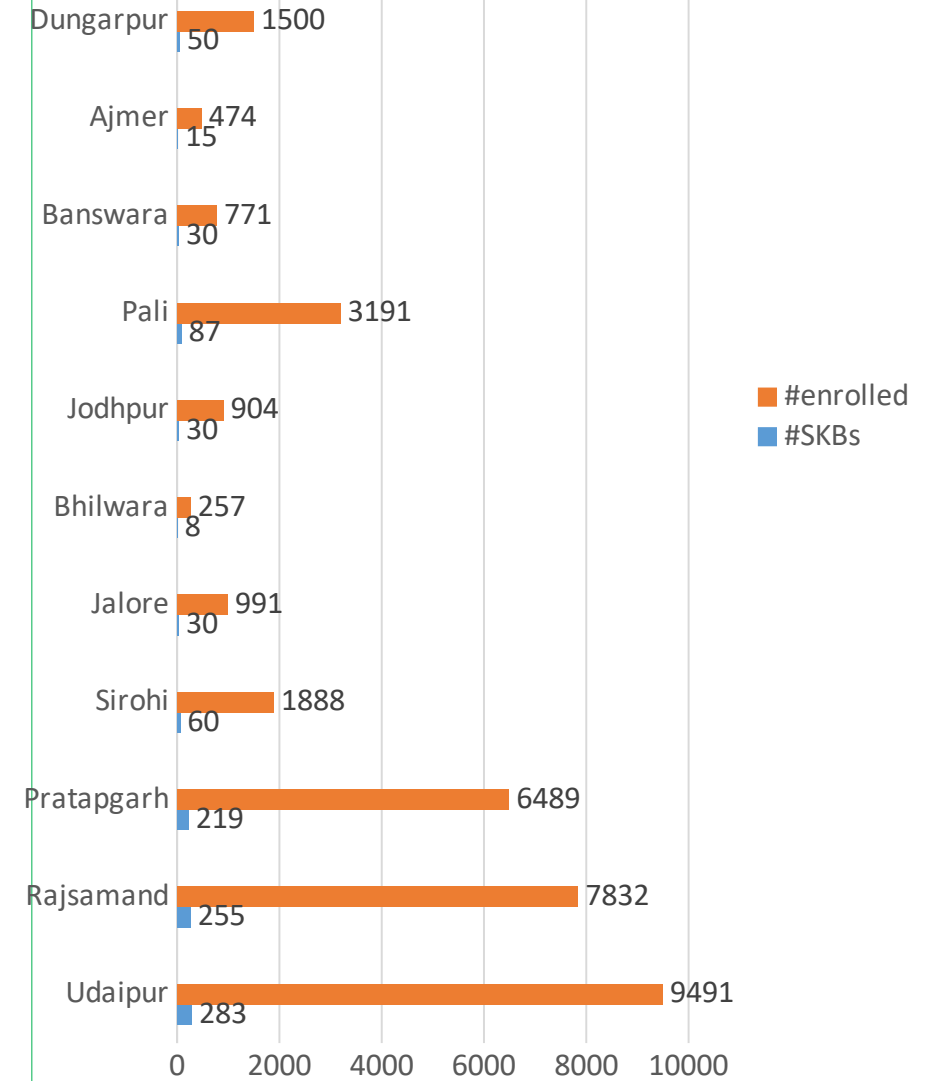

Sakhiyon ki Baadi : geographical reach



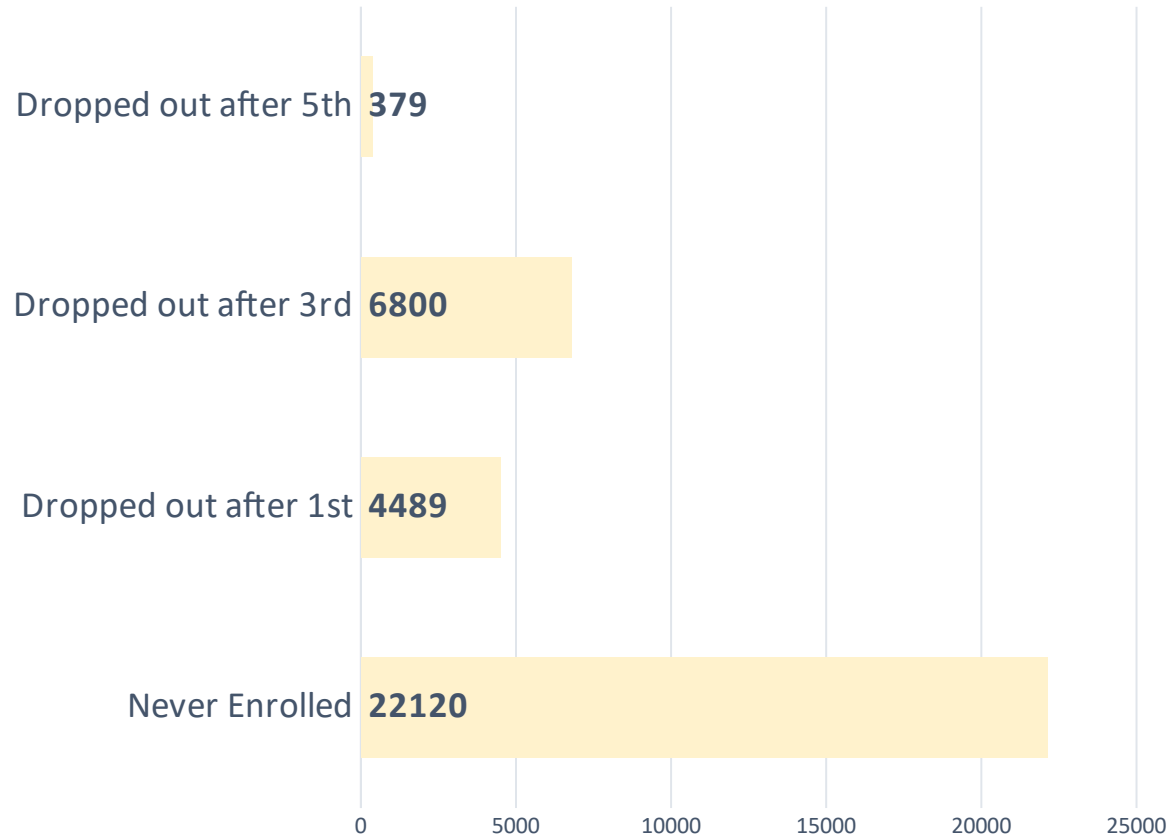
District wise enrolment



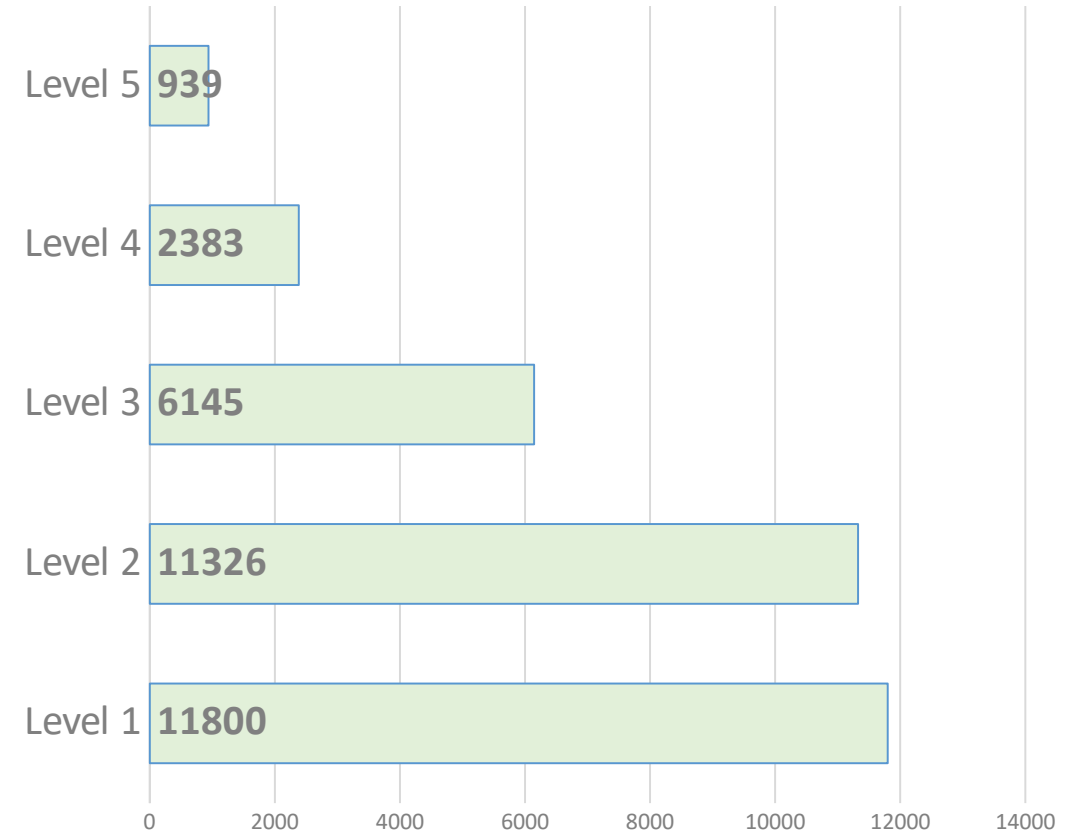
Sakhiyon ki Baadi: Impact

Current situation of girls



SKB has 4 blind, 8 hearing & speech impaired, 12 physically handicapped, 3 mentally unstable, 938 girls with only mother, 1612 girls with only father and 168 girls with No parents.



Lali is 8 years old from Bicchiwada in Dungarpur where female literacy rate is 28%. She like everybody in her village was never enrolled and was completely illiterate. Now in level 2, Lali can recognise Hindi and English alphabets, can count upto 50 and has consistently been awarded as the best student of Sanchiya SKB.

Durga, Shanti & Anita was three sisters of a widowed mother in Kotada Block of Udaipur. They used to work on brick kiln early in the morning and graze cattle and take care of household chores. Now enrolled in Panarwa SKB, they are excited to get a star for a superlative performance in the level test.

First week at "Samiti ki Bhil Basti" in Khamnor, the happiness at being able to write is palpable. With entire village being illiterate, the daksha comes from nearby village. SKB runs from 11am – 3pm post which the daksha on her own initiative gathers women from the village and runs adult education classes in the same premises. With full support from the sarpanch and community, this village will never be the same again.

Chouras: School for children of construction workers.



Location: Rise Resort & Residences by Rise Builders; Sector 1; Noida

Children enrolled : **Oct – 45; Dec – 53; Feb – 38; March 15 - 42**

On an average children spend between 2 months to 4 months on each construction site along with their parents.

Most of the children were never enrolled and could read basic alphabets and write their names. They also learnt new poems and songs.

Most importantly they did not play on sand and with stones in these months.

Program for revitalising Government schools in Rajasthan : Over 4500 children benefitted



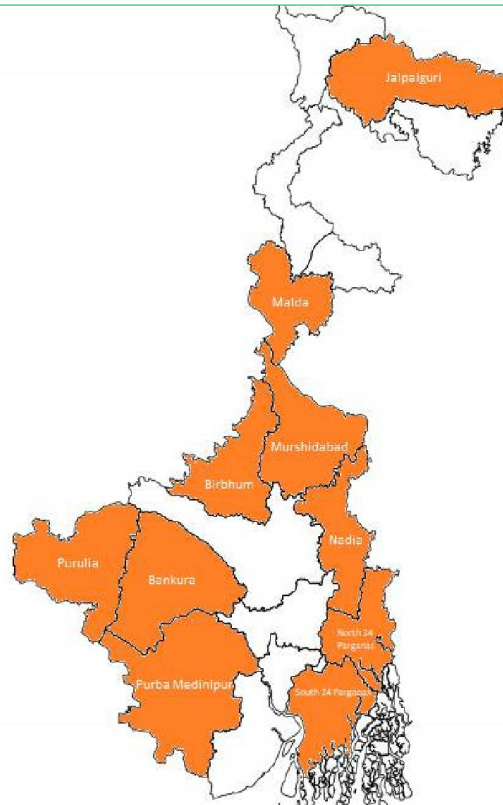
Three schools adopted for constructing additional rooms:
Kadechawas, Gogunda, Udaipur – 3 class rooms & toilet block
Khamnor, Rajsamand – 4 class rooms & toilet block
Banokda, Kumbhalgarh, Rajsamand – 2 class rooms & toilet block

9 smart boards were installed:
Kadechawas, Challi & Undithal in Udaipur; Khamnor & Kumbhalgarh in Rajsamand; Dudu in Jaipur, Shri Dungargarh in Bikaner in Kota and in Jodhpur.

Financial Education & Inclusion – West Bengal

- 51,441 women reached across 10 districts through 1100 village volunteers & 18 village mitra's
- 19,237 women linked with various financial schemes of the Government.
- Over 10,000 women updated their KYC and started using their bank accounts opened under jandhan yojana more effectively.
- 12,600 children across 180 schools in west Bengal attended financial literacy and awareness program.
- 300 youths were trained in nuances of digital financial inclusion and cash less transactions

Health



- Over 1,15,000 pilgrims took advantage of free preventive health camp at Pandharpur; over 3,663 eye patients were given free spectacles and 1196 poor patients were provided free cataract surgeries. Over 1600 patients received free dental services and 68 patients were given free dentures.
- Over 1200 women from Bangalore slums were screened for existence of cancer out of which 189 women were provided with further reference and support.
- Over 300 terminally ill children were provided with nutritional support in Mumbai.

Disaster Relief



- The devastating floods in Gujarat & Rajasthan washed away numerous homes and hopes. IIFL Foundation supported relief & rehabilitation for 1200 families in the worst affected Pali & Sirohi district of Rajasthan.
- IIFL Employees collected clothes and household essentials which were distributed to 120 families.
- In Gujarat IIFL Foundation conducted medical relief camp in association with the Government of Gujarat.
